When I changed from driving a CJ7 to a TJ I noticed that the visibility in the TJ was not as good as in my CJ or my wife's YJ.

I found out that when Jeep designed the TJ they lowered the seats one and one half inches in order to comply with the DOT air bag impact zone for tall people.

I am a bit over 5'7". I bought a set of 2" seat risers on the internet. The set came with 8 spacers and grade 8 bolts and washers to raise the driver and passenger seats. I only used half of the set and raised the driver's seat. The difference in the visibility for a short guy like me is really improved. Installation is easy, takes about 15 - 20 minutes per seat to install.

Since I only raised the driver's seat I have the other 4 spacers and hardware for sale for \$30.

Pickup at my home in Crest.
