- Special Equipment:** Minimum: rear locker, front recommended. Highly suggest full skid plates. 33's on a short wheel base 35's on JKU or similar. A stock Rubicon could do this trail but you will have bumps and bruises and maybe a bad attitude by the end of the day. Your driving ability can greatly effect these minimum requirements.
- Trail Description:** I absolutely love this trail! I have led 4 or 5 DD runs on this trail and most everyone says the same thing: "That was awesome! When can we run it again?"

We will be traveling east-to-west which presents us with a challenging gate-keeper to keep us honest in our abilities. The trail ascends rapidly and by lunch we should have the toughest parts of the trail behind us. There are beautiful vistas of the high desert throughout and the lunch spot is truly picturesque.

My personal opinion this is the toughest trail in the greater Big Bear area. There are 2 parts of this trail that can be extremely tough to pass depending on the condition of the trail.
