Run Description	Race Track through Hunter Mountain Road/Lippincott Pass, Marble and Cottonwood Canyons, and Titus Canyon		
Trail Description	Cottonwood Canyons, and Titus Canyon Day 1: With this excursion, be prepared to camp as the plan is to complete trails beginning with travel to see the famous and very popular Racetrack through Hunter Mountain Road. After we reach the Racetrack, we will travel back through the Lippincott Pass back to Saline Valley Road heading south to where we started. Next is to travel East on the 190 to Stovepipe Wells to head a slight North on what is first a paved road of a campground leading to the next trail. As we reach our destination traveling East on the 190, we will decide on how to set up a camp to where we accomodate all our Dirt Devil Members and guest to a situation where we are comfortble and can enjoy each others' company through the rest of the day and evening. Day 2: Stovepipe Wells has a gas stop and restroom that will be the next meeting location once again at 8AM. As we continue, we will travel to Marble Canyon for a view of the Cottonwood Mountains and next into Cottonwood Canyon to see a cave. We will then loop back and finish with Titus Canyon. In order to reach Titus Canyon, we will be heading northeast from Stovepipe Wells on Highway 190 and connect to Highway 374 towards Beatty, NV. The start of Titus Canyon is on the left 6.5 miles East of state line. With travel through this trail and depending on time, we will have some moments for Vista Points, some old buildings, geological rocks, petroglyths, as well as possibly exploring a ghost town and mine. As we finish, we will make time for a stop at Scotty's Castle and/or Ubehebe Crater. Depending on everything, I will find camping nearby in the park at these final points of interest or another source outside of the park before heading home the next day.
