Red sticker program

(copied from CAL4wheel)



All currently registered Red Stickered vehicles, which includes almost half of off-road motorcycles, a few small quads and very few side-by-sides will be grandfathered into the Green Sticker Program in 2025. This will allow year round legal riding for these vehicles in all California OHV areas. The Red Sticker Program was created to address issues in areas of air quality non-attainment. Competition bikes and many 2-stroke engines could not meet the California Air Quality Board (CARB) air quality requirements. These

vehicles were lumped under a special Red Sticker Program that allowed them to operate only at specific times of the year in non-attainment areas.

As it turned out, the prime riding season in many of these areas corresponded with the Red Stickers' allowed months This made the Red Sticker a less than viable tool for air quality assurance. CARB was frustrated with the number of non-compliant bikes being sold in California and primarily used for recreation and not racing or competition.

Years of discussions have ensued to find a fair and equitable way to finish out the Red Sticker Program and ensure the sales of more compliant bikes.

The grandfather clause is a huge gift to all of us who own Red Sticker bikes allowing us to continue to register, own, operate as well as legally buy and sell them.

California is a huge market for the motorcycle industry, and just as they did with the outlawing of - wheelers and the end of 2-stroke quads, they will find a way to bring high performance, fast, and fun equipment to their showrooms all while meeting the CARB requirements. This won't be overnight, but industry has known this was on the way. The R&D shops are working to be first to fill this market void.

Tech ideas

Grease

I have had trouble with the control arm bushings falling apart. My solution has been to grease more frequently. I first loosen up the nut which takes pressure off the control arm end brackets. Allowing grease to more easily flow into the bolt and bushing.

The LockNLube grease coupler along with a long grease hose grabs the zerk and reduces waste.

I have also invested in other LockNLube accessories. I have a 110v Lincoln grease gun, but LockNLube sells a Milwaukee battery operated grease gun which also looks like a good idea.

The club now has it own license

Jay announced that the FCC has issued the Dirt Devils a club license Jay applied for a vanity call sign and got the approval this morning. Our new club call sign is KK1DD. In order to use the club call sign on runs, we will need to have a ham control operator (someone with a HAM radio call sign) on every run.

the club having its own license gives us the option of having non-licensed people on our runs being able to use their ham radios with the club call sign as long as they are on a run with a licensed operator.

We strongly encourage everyone get their own license. Please See Mike Wallace for help Programming your HAM Radios.

HAM update/report.

Jay Van Wormer went over the club license for the new members/guests.

If you are interesting getting your HAM license, the HAM radio testing pool questions are on the club website. There are 100 questions in the pool and they pull 35 questions for the test, you can get 9 wrong and still pass. If you study, you can pass the test. Jay encourages members to get licensed.

Live classes are starting to come up again, testing and radio information on the HAM & CB Radio tab on the club website.

The FCC is looking to mandate a \$50 fee for licenses (currently free) so if you want to get your license, now is the time to do it.

There are lots of advantages of HAM over CB, you have more distance for communication, better quality.

Handheld radios are fine for the club but are not as efficient as the mounted radio with an exterior antenna.

The cow bell rules are: Cow bells are awarded from air down to air up. If you get stuck and are unable to move under your own power and need the help of a winch or you get strapped from one of your fellow Dirt Devils then you have earned the privilege of hanging the cow bell from your front bumper. You must leave the cow bell on the front of your rig until another Dirt Devil gets stuck. Then you help attach the cow bell to their bumper.
