CAL4wheel alert Don't let BLM close Moab's trail system

The Bureau of Land Management in Southern Utah is updating the Travel Management Plan for the Labyrinth Rims/Gemini Bridges area near Moab. This region is one of the most popular areas in the world for off-road recreation. The BLM reached a settlement with the Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance (SUWA) over routes that SUWA felt should be closed, and the BLM is now required to re-analyze popular trails like Rusty Nail, Hey Joe Canyon, Gold Bar Rim, and 10 Mile Wash. The travel management area covers over 300,000 acres of BLM managed land in portions of Grand County, Utah and includes many highlyvalued OHV trails. **Over 400 miles of OHV routes are at risk of closure.**

Run Reports

Holcomb Creek 10/15/22

Run Leader - Robert Gabrielson

We met at 9:00am at the Crab Flats trailhead near green valley lake and ran the trail West to East. We had a total of 13 rigs, 7 member and 6 guests. 2 TJ, rest JK/JL.

One member discovered he had a broken rear shock mount, which he was able to relocate to the factory mount which were fortunately still installed.

After a quick driver meeting, we departed at 9:30am. Weather was a nice 60 degrees, and clear skies with a chance of rain about 2pm.

Upon starting at the West gatekeeper, VP Katy's rig wouldn't go into 4Lo. It was determined that after a recent body lift that was installed, the transfer case linkage wasn't adjusted properly. A couple wrenches resolved this issue.

The group made it through the gatekeeper with little difficulty, with only a couple rigs needing additional spotting to get around obstacles.

The rest of the trail to the middle rock garden was uneventful, with no traffic encountered.

Upon coming to the center rock garden, we came across a small group having issues getting through (coming from the

East). This group ended up being led by none other than our own President, Tim.

The Dirt Devils went to work and helped get their 2 stock JKs through the rock garden, with many rock stacking and restacking required to keep them moving. After about 45 minutes, we were able to get them through.

Our group entered the rock garden. Leader Robert decided to try a line to the far left, over two large boulders, taking the chance for a cowbell. Fortunately, it all worked out and he got through just fine.

Most of the group took an easier line to the right, without difficulty.

Two other guests also tried the optional line and made it through without issue.

We then stopped for a quick lunch just after the obstacle before moving on.

The rest of the trail was completed without issue, and the group exited to the East about 1:30pm.

It was discovered later that one guest also broke a front shock shaft at air up. He was able to get home without issue.

No cowbells to report.

Going down is not as difficult as going up, but you do need to touch the throttle a bit to avoid rolling over.

As a side note my kids and their families came up and camped in their camp trailers with their kids, they visited Calico ghost town and said it was great.

The club has it's HAM own license

Jay announced that the FCC has issued the Dirt Devils a club license Jay applied for a vanity call sign and got the approval this morning. Our new club call sign is KK1DD. In order to use the club call sign on runs, we will need to have a ham control operator (someone with a HAM radio call sign) on every run.

the club having its own license gives us the option of having non-licensed people on our runs being able to use their ham radios with the club call sign as long as they are on a run with a licensed operator.

We strongly encourage everyone get their own license. Please See Mike Wallace for help Programming your HAM Radios.

If you are interesting getting your HAM license, the HAM radio testing pool questions are on the club website. There are 100 questions in the pool and they pull 35 questions for the test, you can get 9 wrong and still pass. If you study, you can pass the test. The Dirt Devils encourages members to get licensed.

Live classes are starting to come up again, testing and radio information on the HAM & CB Radio tab on the club website.

There are lots of advantages of HAM over CB, you have more distance for communication, better quality.

Handheld radios are fine for the club but are not as efficient as the mounted radio with an exterior antenna.

The cow bell rules are: Cow bells are awarded from air down to air up. If you get stuck and are unable to move under your own power and need the help of a winch or you get strapped from one of your fellow Dirt Devils then you have earned the privilege of hanging the cow bell from your front bumper. You must leave the cow bell on the front of your rig until another Dirt Devil gets stuck. Then you help attach the cow bell to their bumper.
