Burns Canyon Road (2N02) is an easy scenic route from Pioneer Town up to Big Bear Lake area. We added in a few Moderate to Difficult sections to spice things up a bit. Made a short hop over to the trailhead in Rimrock where we got aired down and hit the trail.

The trails were awesome for our run on the flat and easy 2N04 Burns Canyon, 2N61Y Round Valley rutted and eroded earning its black diamond for a ¼ mile stretch of rock garden. Our bonus run up Tip Top Mountain proved it to be in good shape. The final stretch through Balky Horse 2N04 was scenic and rocky most the way, easier than the Moderate rating it carries.

With the guidance of spotter to jeeps made it up. Then Mark C. went for the bonus line with his built LJJ and got hung up on a boulder that he has been over many times over the years. We winched him up and over, but minor damage to some of the undercarriage will be addressed by Mark and his friends soon. Recent rains have eroded the dirt and basically more of the boulder was exposed. So, a well-earned Cowbell goes out the Mark. Fun times in the garage to follow. After watching several jeeps through the obstacles Ed and Scott V. in their Chevy Silverado with Independent front suspension opted out and headed home.
